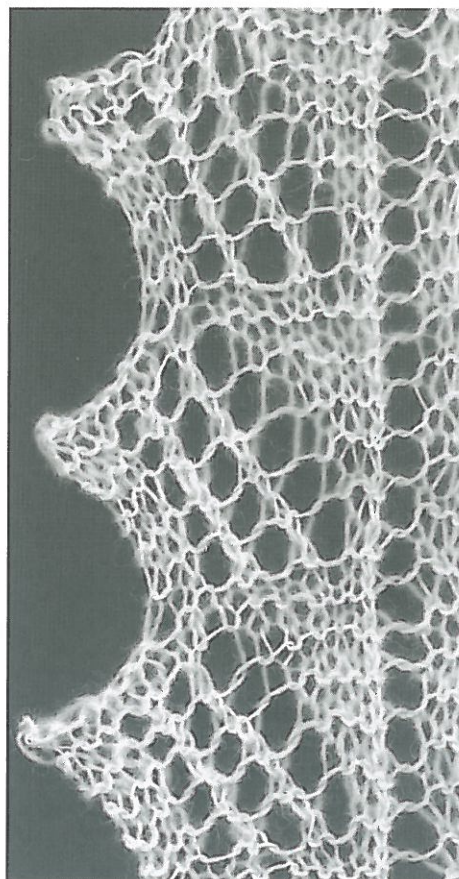


The Brand Iron Edging

I chart the edging exactly as it is given to be worked finally around the completed shawl, this means the first stitch on odd rows is shown as *slipped*, it could just be plain knitted should you prefer.

Row 11: The number 13 tells you to knit 13 plain stitches after the “knit 2 together”, to the end of the row.

Remember: Knit stitch all the blank squares in the pattern outline on the even rows – the first and last stitch on these rows are marked with dots – get used to remembering that empty squares (and stitches with numerals) in these patterns are always plain knitted this way. By omitting unnecessary symbols like this, the patterns are easier to read and follow.
