# Northern Lace by Elizabeth Lovick

## Cable and Diamond Scarf for North Ronaldsay Aran Wool

#### **Materials**

one hank North Ronaldsay Aran yarn (200 to 250 g) pair 5.5 mm needles row counter

#### **Measurements**

about 7.5 ins wide and 56 ins long (adjustable)

#### **Abbreviations**

sts - stitches k - knit p - purl
m1 - make 1 by picking up the strand before the next stitch and knitting into the back of it



#### **Tension**

38 sts across the pattern gives a scarf about 7.5 ins wide. Twice through the pattern (24 rows) is about 4 ins.

#### **Working from a Chart**

Each **square** represents one **stitch**. A **blank** square is worked as a **knit** stitch when the **right** side is facing and a **purl** stitch when the **wrong** side is facing. A **filled** square is worked as a **purl** stitch when the **right** side is facing and a **knit** stitch when the **wrong** side is facing.

The chart is read from the bottom up.

When working to and fro, read right side rows from right to left and wrong side rows from left to right. When working in the round, read all rows from right to left.


#### The Scarf

With 5.5 mm needles cast on 35 sts. Work as follows:


row 1 p1, \*k1, p1. Repeat from \* to the end of the row rows 2 and 3 as row 1

row 4 (p1, k1) three times, m1, (p1, k1) six times, m1, (p1, k1) five times, m1, (p1, k1) three times, p1. 38 sts

Now work from the chart, noting that the pattern has a 12 row repeat.



#### <u>Key</u>



(blank) k on right side, p on wrong side

p on right side, k on wrong side

C4B – put next 2 sts on a cable needle and leave at the back of the work, k2, k2 from cable needle

**Continue in pattern** until the work measures 55 ins or about 1 in less than the required length, finishing after a 6th row.

#### Continue as follows:

row 1 (p1, k1) twice, p1, k2tog, (p1, k1) five times, p1, k2tog, (p1, k1) five times, p1, k2tog, (p1, k1) twice, p1.

row 2 p1, \*k1, p1. Repeat from \* to the end of the row

row 3 as row 2

row 4 cast off in pattern.

Weave in ends. Wash the scarf and pin to shape while wet. Allow to dry.

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
