



Hexa-ghan

Here is a tutorial for how I made my hexa-ghan blanket.

This blanket could easily be adapted for any yarn/gauge you want. It would make an excellent sock blanket and there's NO SEAMING NEEDED – yeah!

Materials Used:

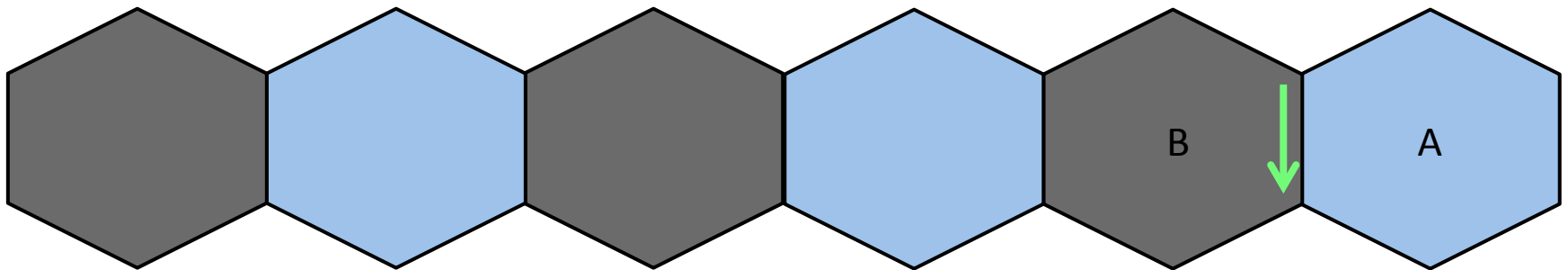
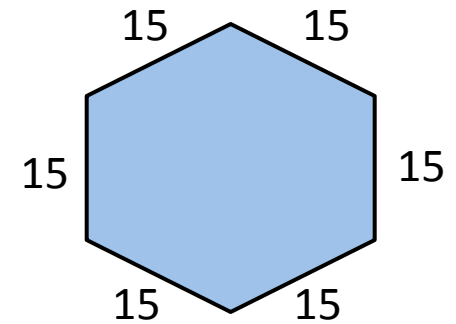
US Size 10 dpns (you'll need four dpns for this project)

About 900 yards of Worsted weight yarn (color A)

About 900 yards of Worsted weight yarn (color B)

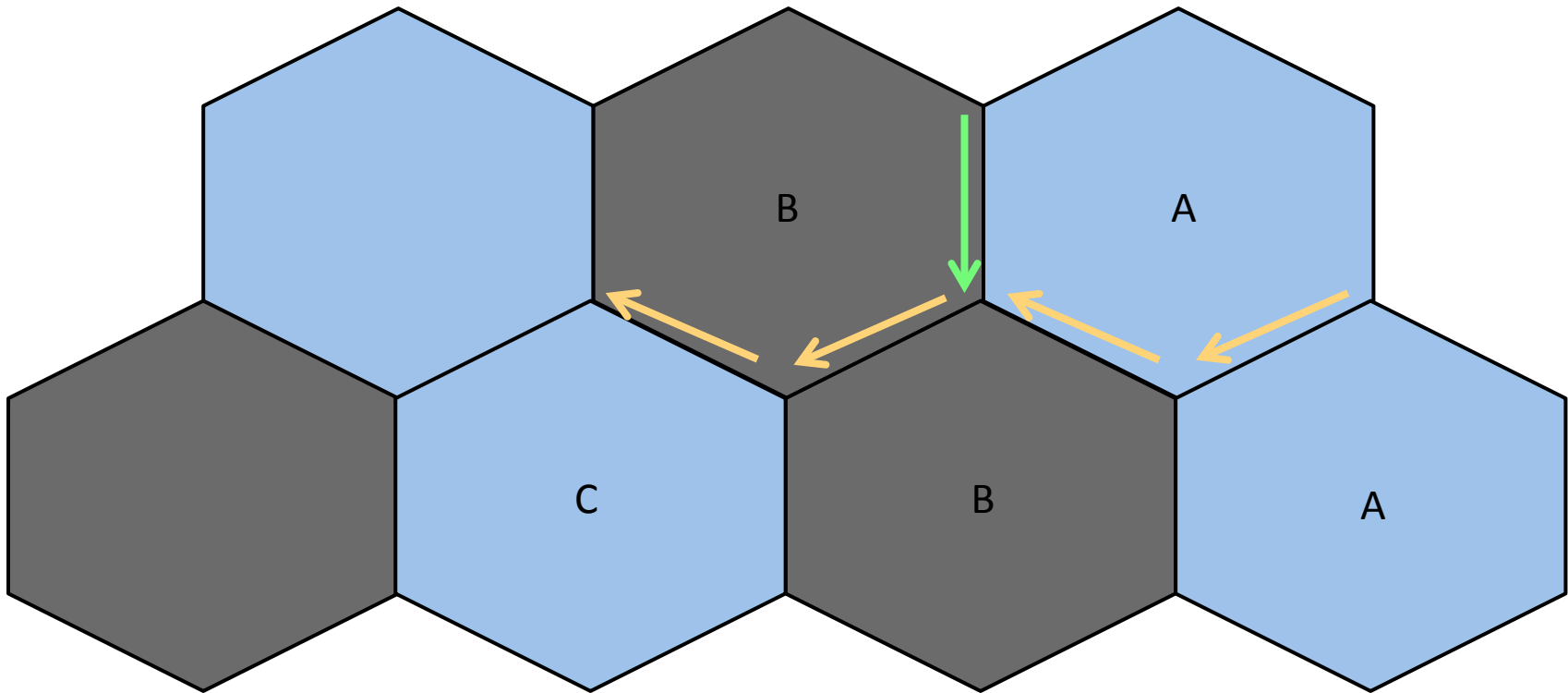
First row of hexagons (all hexagons have 15 sts per side)

- *Hexagon A, row 1:* Cast-on 90 stitches, 30 on each of three dpns, work hexagon instructions below - *All hexagons are worked using the same instructions (only the cast-on/pick-up numbers vary)*
 - Row 1: (p15, pm, p15)* repeat two more times
 - Row 2 (**Decrease row**): (k to 2 sts before marker, k2tog, k to 2 sts before end of needle, k2tog)* repeat two more times
 - Row 3: purl all stitches
 - Row 4: work *decrease row*
 - Row 5: knit all stitches
 - Repeat last two rows until you have 12 stitches on each needle (36 total)
 - All remaining rows are worked as *decrease row*
 - When you only have two stitches per needle, cut yarn. Pull tail through remaining stitches and tie off
- *Hexagon B and remainder of first row of hexagons:* Cast on 75 stitches, 30 on each of the first two dpns, 15 on the third. With third dpn, pick up 15 sts along one edge of previously worked hexagon (green arrow)
 - Work hexagon instructions.
- Continue working hexagons until desired blanket length



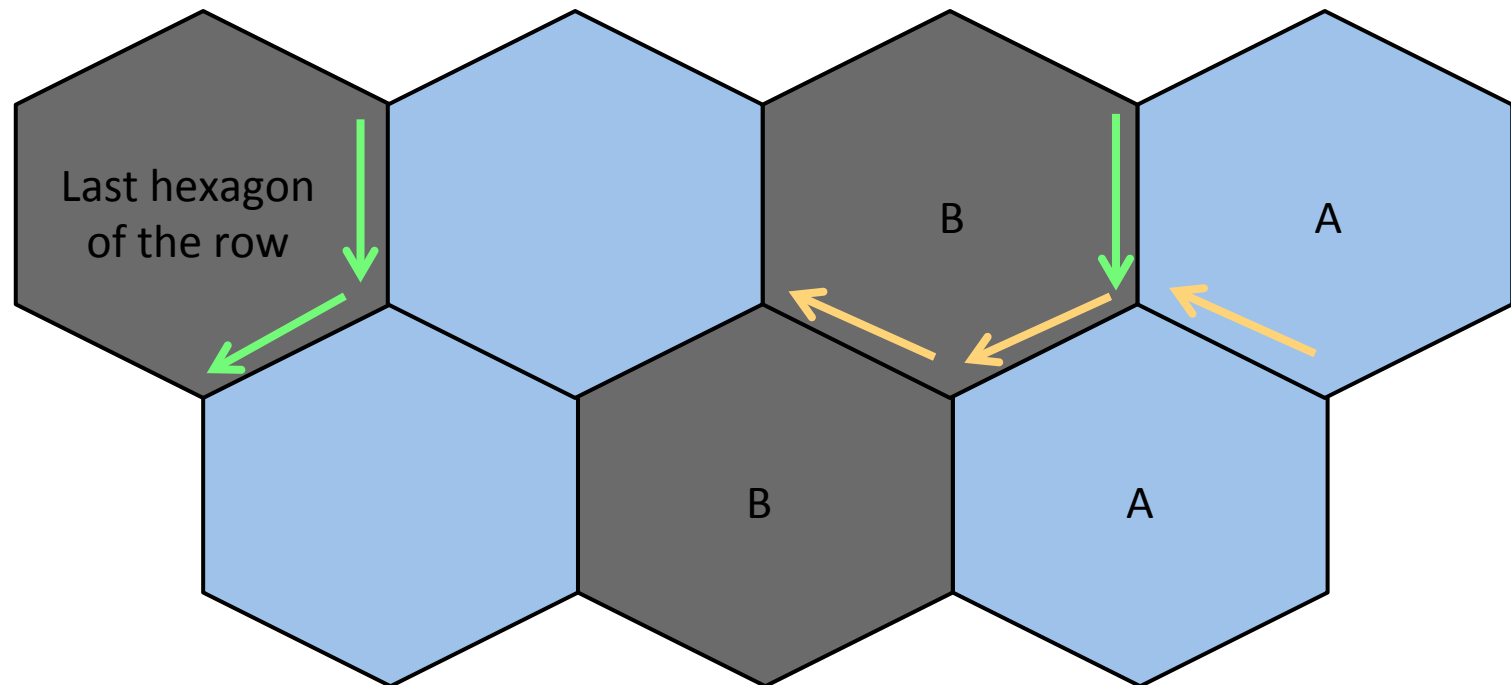
Second (and subsequent even-numbered) hexagon row(s)

- *Hexagon A:* Cast-on 60 sts (30 on each of two dpns), with third dpn, pick up 15 sts from hexagon A of row below, and 15 from hexagon B of row below (orange arrows). Work hexagon instructions.
- *Hexagon B (and subsequent hexagons for this row):* Cast-on 45, 30 on needle 1, 15 on needle 2. With needle 2, pick up 15 sts along the side of previously worked hexagon (green arrow), with third dpn, pick up 15 from hexagon B of row below, and 15 from hexagon C of row below. Work hexagon instructions.



Third (and subsequent odd-numbered) hexagon row(s)

- *Hexagon A:* Cast on 75 stitches, 30 on the first two dpns, 15 on the third. With third dpn, pick up 15 sts along top-right edge of hexagon A from row below (orange arrow).
- *Hexagon B (and all but the last hexagon for this row):* Cast-on 45, 30 on needle 1, 15 on needle 2. With needle 2, pick up 15 sts along the side of previously worked hexagon (green arrow), with third dpn, pick up 15 from hexagon A of row below, and 15 from hexagon B of row below (orange arrows). Work hexagon instructions.
- *Last hexagon of odd-numbered row:* Cast-on 60 sts (30 on each of two dpns), with third dpn, pick up 15 from side of previously worked hexagon, and 15 from last hexagon of row below (green arrows). Work hexagon instructions.



Continue alternating the even- and odd-numbered row instructions until the blanket is the desired width/length. I worked my proto-type in the color/pattern below but customize however you want! Can finish off the edging with a single-crochet border, but it will look nice without it as well. Enjoy!
